

7th Grade Course Descriptions 2018-2019

REQUIRED CLASSES

ENGLISH 7 Year (Fee)

This course is an overview of language, literature, oral work, reading and writing.

ENGLISH 7/READ 180 Year (Fee)

This is a specialized reading class for students in 7th grade. The class is a regular 7th grade English class but is mixed with a reading curriculum designed to help improve students' reading levels and comprehension more than a typical English class. If you feel like your student might be a good fit for this class, please make a note on your registration form and contact Mrs. Webb in the counseling office. *Teacher approval required*.

<u>INTERMEDIATE MATH I</u> Year (Fee)

In Intermediate Math 1 students will focus on developing understanding of and applying proportional relationships; developing understanding of operations with rational numbers and working with expressions and linear equations; solving problems involving scale drawings and informal geometric constructions, and working with two- and three-dimensional shapes to solve problems involving area, surface area, and volume; and drawing inferences about populations based on samples.

INTEGRATED SCIENCE 7 Year (Fee)

Topics from physical, earth, and life science are integrated in this course to illustrate the nature of "structure" as a property that is common to all sciences. Students observe that all substances are made of smaller parts and are themselves part of larger wholes, and that when parts come together the whole often has properties that are very different from its parts. Hands-on, inquiry-based instruction is used to help student's value science as a process for obtaining knowledge based on observable evidence.

COLLEGE & CAREER AWARENESS Year (Fee)

Core concepts help students to explore their interests and career opportunities through interactive, hands-on activities using current technology in a laboratory environment. Students are involved in discovering self, viewing future life options within the context of work and family settings, developing the positive relationships required for communication and teamwork, and identifying the skills required for life's roles. Students are expected to develop skills in decision making, planning, and preparing life's work. CTE is a coordinated exploratory course that includes three cluster areas of Technology, Engineering, Agriculture, Business/Marketing, and Family and Consumer Sciences/Health Science. This course is designed for all students by the Utah State Board of Education.

PE BOYS & GIRLS BEGINNING FITNESS Semester (Fee)

This course emphasized the beginning fitness. An appreciation for activities in relation to physical well-being is stressed. A continual fitness development program with testing is also included in the course.

UTAH HISTORY Semester

Students will be introduced to the significant events, people, cultures, and issues that have influenced Utah from its earliest beginnings through the present day. The first focus is devoted to history and events leading up to 1847 including Native Americans, Spanish, mountain men, explorers, Mormon influences, and the westward movement. The second focus includes conflicts that let to statehood and the integration of Utah into the nation including the early development of mining, railroad, industry, and agriculture, the move from territory to statehood and the new century, structure of state and local government, and the progressive period. The third focus will be on events from the turn of the century to today touching on key periods such as the World Wars, the Great Depression, Post-War Utah, Modern Utah, etc.

FOUNDATION OF LEARNING Semester

This course, which provides students with lifetime learning and living skills, is designed to lay the foundation for success for all other courses offered in high school. The curriculum will focus on learning styles, multiple intelligences, research skills, time management skills, Covey's Seven Habits, cultural literacy, goal setting, project planning, critical thinking, creative thinking, and presentation skills.

READING Semester

This course is designed to help each student improve his or her reading skills, including decoding, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension.

ELECTIVES

LANGUAGES

<u>SPANISH 3 Honors: IMMERSION PROGRAM ONLY</u> Year (Fee) (*Pre-requisite, prior immersion programs students*)

A year long course for students who participate in Spanish Immersion. The curriculum and language instruction will help students understand the 6 AP language themes. (Heritage language speaking students, interested in participating in the Immersion program, will need to have an interview with an Immersion teacher. Parents will also need to talk with an Immersion teacher to learn about program expectations.)

<u>SPANISH CULTURE & MEDIA: IMMERSION PROGRAM ONLY</u> Semester (*Pre-requisite*, *prior immersion programs students*)

A semester class focusing on comparing the history, culture and media of the different Spanish speaking countries. A student in Immersion should take one semester in 7th grade, and one semester in 8th grade.

INTRO TO AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE Semester (Fee)

An introductory course to American Sign Language with basic aspects of language taught as well as a variety of cultural topics and norms. Historical aspects of Deafness included. This course will introduce the learner to the concept of deafness and its implications as it relates to Culture, Community, and Individual. Some parts of this course are taught without using voice.

INTRO TO CHINESE Semester (Fee)

An introductory course designed to give the student an experience with the Chinese language and culture.

INTRO TO SPANISH Semester (Fee)

An introductory course to Spanish language and culture. This is a 1 semester course in which students will develop Spanish interpersonal speaking skills. Students will also gain knowledge of where Spanish is used.

FINE ART

ART FOUNDATIONS 1 Semester (Fee)

This course is designed for beginning students who wish to enhance their ability to draw. Students will explore the basics of drawing, focusing on the 7 elements of art, using graphite, ink, and color media. It is a prerequisite to all other art classes at Vista Heights.

MUSIC

BEGINNING CHOIR Semester (Fee)

Students receive experience in rehearsal and performance of suitable music for SSA (soprano, 2nd soprano, alto and TB (tenor and bass) voices.

BEGINNING BRASS Year (Fee)

This course provides opportunities for students to develop their musical potential through learning to play a brass instrument. Study includes the care and cultivation of a beautiful tone, the ability to read music, the building of technical skills, team spirit, and responsible rehearsal habits. Students will have opportunities to improvise, compose, strengthen listening skills, analyze performances and relate their music experiences to the time and culture or the pieces they study, as well as to contemporary society. An ensemble directed toward building music performance skills in percussion. Curriculum includes 2-4 performances per year including introduction to music theory, history, and composition.

BEGINNING WOODWINDS Year (Fee)

This course provides opportunities for students to develop their musical potential through learning to play a brass instrument. Study includes the care and cultivation of a beautiful tone, the ability to read music, the building of technical skills, team spirit, and responsible rehearsal habits. Students will have opportunities to improvise, compose, strengthen listening skills, analyze performances and relate their music experiences to the time and culture or the pieces they study, as well as to contemporary society; an instrumental ensemble directed toward building music performance skills. Curriculum includes 6-8 performances per year including adjudicated music festivals, introduction to music theory, history and composition.

CONCERT BAND Year (Fee)

This intermediate instrumental ensemble is directed toward building music performance skills in preparation for Symphonic Band. Curriculum may include six to eight performances per year including adjudicated music festivals, varsity games, and introductions to music theory, history, and composition. *Teacher approval required*.

BEGINNING PERCUSSION Year (Fee)

This course provides opportunities for students to develop their musical potential and aesthetic understanding through learning to play percussion instruments. Study includes the building of proper technique on all percussion instruments, the ability to read music, team spirit, and responsible rehearsal habits. Students will have opportunities to improvise, compose, strengthen listening skills, analyze performances and relate their music experiences to the time and culture of the pieces they study, as well as to contemporary society. Two years piano or previous instrument experience and audition.

BEGINNING CELLO/BASS Year (Fee)

This course provides opportunities for students to develop their musical potential and aesthetic understanding through learning to play orchestral string instruments. Study includes the care and cultivation of a beautiful tone, the ability to read music, the building of technical skills, team spirit, and responsible rehearsal habits. Students will have opportunities to improvise, compose, strengthen listening skills, analyze performances and relate their music experiences to the time and culture of the pieces they study, as well as to contemporary society.

BEGINNING VIOLIN/VIOLA Year (Fee)

This course provides opportunities for students to develop their musical potential and aesthetic understanding through learning to play orchestral string instruments. Study includes the care and cultivation of a beautiful tone, the ability to read music, the building of technical skills, team spirit, and responsible rehearsal habits. Students will have opportunities to improvise, compose, strengthen listening skills, analyze performances and relate their music experiences to the time and culture of the pieces they study, as well as to contemporary society.

CADET ORCHESTRA Year (Fee)

This course further develops and refines core concepts and fundamentals introduced in Beginning Orchestra. Study includes the care and cultivation of a beautiful tone, the ability to read music with increasing fluency, the building of technical skills, team spirit, and responsible rehearsal habits. Students will have opportunities to improvise, compose, strengthen listening skills, analyze performances and relate their music experiences to the time and culture of the pieces they study, as well as to contemporary society. *Pre-requisite course is Beginning Orchestra. Teacher approval required.*

INTERMEDIATE ORCHESTRA Year (Fee)

This course provides opportunities for students to develop their musical potential and aesthetic understanding through learning to play orchestral string instruments. Study includes the care and cultivation of a beautiful tone, the ability to read music with increasing fluency, the building of technical skills, team spirit, and responsible rehearsal habits. Students will have opportunities to improvise, compose, strengthen listening skills, analyze performances and relate their music experiences to the time and culture of the pieces they study, as well as to contemporary society. *Prerequisite course is Beginning Orchestra, or audition. Teacher Approval required.*

DRAMA

DRAMA FOUNDATIONS Semester

This course introduces the student to the beginning elements of theatre and performance with emphasis of self-improvement in performance and public communication. Mime, oral interpretation, scene and monologue study are taught along with production criticism and dramatic and comedic literature. The students will study audition techniques, scene performance, cinema appreciation and criticism, and an introduction to acting.

DRAMA & FILM Semester

This course matches the State Core Standards of Theater Foundations and focuses on the elements of film both behind and in front of the camera. Students will study the elements of film and learn how to analyze techniques of cinematography, direction, acting, etc. Students will learn how to evaluate film.

DANCE

DANCE 1 Semester (Fee)

In this introduction to dance, beginning dance techniques and movements will be taught. This beginning level class will explore rhythms, style, and techniques of modern and jazz dance, emphasizing the basic elements of choreography.

OTHER CLASSES

AEROBICS Semester (Fee)

This total body fitness class involves cardiovascular exercises as well as body toning exercises. Exercise routines will be choreographed to music. Basic principles of fitness will be taught and applied in class. *This class does NOT fill any PE credit.*

EXPLORING TECHNOLOGY 1 Semester (Fee)

Students will be introduced to the technological systems of aerospace, communications, construction, energy/power/transportation, manufacturing, and biotechnology. The course emphasis is on exploration activities using computers, technology equipment, and wood working tools.

EXPLORING AGRICULTURE 7 Semester

Exploring Agriculture Education analyzes the different aspects of the agricultural industry. This course is designed to introduce students to the vast opportunities available in Agricultural Education. Students will be given the opportunity to learn how agriculture affects their daily lives. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in FFA activities.

CREATIVE WRITING Semester (Fee)

This class is designed to provide experiences and activities which will enhance the communication of ideas through written expression.

CREATIVE WRITING (NOVEL) Semester (Fee)

This class is designed to provide experiences and activities which will enhance the communication of ideas through written expression. Contrition will be on writing novels.

MYTHOLOGY Semester (Fee)

Study of Greek, Roman, Scandinavian, and American folklore and mythology will help students learn to appreciate the impact they have on our literature.

JOURNALISM A (Intro) Semester (Fee)

Introduction to journalism is an exciting, fast-paced orientation into the highly competitive field of journalism. This course will give students a chance to work in an upbeat environment where you will improve writing, interviewing and photography skills, work with programs like Adobe InDesign and Premiere Pro and learn to use equipment such as digital cameras, video cameras, sound recorders and lighting equipment. Students will learn their civic responsibility through a close examination of the First Amendment with specific attention placed on the Freedom of Press and Freedom of Speech.

PEER TUTOR Semester

Students will be involved in peer tutoring students in special education and resource classes in math, English, reading, life skills and other academic areas. This class would be most helpful to students considering a career in teaching, coaching, etc. This course involves working with disabled students. It is extremely important that the students chosen for this class have a very good attendance record. During the school year this class goes on a number of community trips, a few of them may require the student to bring a dollar or so.
